## Vandals and Thieves Not Welcome in Greenfield

Late in the spring, we were finally able to get new (and newly positioned) security lights for our playground at Greenfield, thanks to Ep-cor. Unfortunately, the lights do not seem to have made much difference to the levels of activity – some of which is definitely undesirable - in and around the park at night. Of course, the warm weather will always result in more people in the park at all hours, but unfortunately some of our "patrons" have been decidedly anti-social, leaving behind liquor bottles, broken glass and graffiti. Obviously, whoever is responsible doesn't think about the hundreds of families who are our legitimate park users – in fact, they probably don't think, period. Worst of all, we have recently had two expensive break-ins –

one each in the main Community Hall and the tennis/skate shack. Not only do these take time and money to fix, they are entirely unnecessary, as nothing of value – or that could be easily disposed of for cash - is stored in either building.

So what can we do? We have already engaged a security company to conduct nightly, random visits to our park and grounds (regrettable that we have to spend even more of our Community League's money to do this), and will be taking further steps to make the area as secure as possible in the coming months. The best deterrent, however, is for all of us as



Greenfield residents not to turn a blind eye, but to be aware of what's going on. If you see something suspicious, call the police complaints line (780-423-4567) – take note of whatever you can – the number of people, what they are wearing, descriptions and license plate numbers of vehicles. Let's show we care about our community and its facilities, and do what we can to keep it a great, safe place to live.

## Influencing a New Education Act: Have you shared your ideas?

Over the summer, the Minister of Education's consultation on how to transform the education system continued. From the Inspiring Education dialogue (which ended last fall), the government has now moved into the Inspiring Action phase. The comments received on the Minister's suggested principles will help to shape a new Education Act tentatively slated for discussion in the winter legislative session, so this is a wonderful opportunity to influence the future of education in our province.

The first topic opened for discussion online was Parent and Community Engagement, which seems a pertinent topic to write about in a community newsletter! The support of a community for its schools and vice versa is vital, and it is great to see this up for discussion. I participated in the online facilitated discussion on July

22, and out of that discussion, ideas about specific ways to move forward on parent and community engagement were posted in the online IDEA FORUM. These ideas are open for discussion by all citizens until late October, and I encourage you to provide your perspectives. Or feel free to give me a call at 780-887-1002 or email [Catherine.Ripley@epsb.ca](mailto:Catherine.Ripley@epsb.ca).

Currently the main "community"-related topics posted for discussion are 1) Schools as Community Centres, 2) School Board/ Community Partnerships, and 3) School Council Action as an Engagement Strategy for the Broader Community. Ideas around "Schools as Community Centres" include (so far) encouraging a sense of community ownership and maximizing unused spaces in schools. Ideas around "Partnerships" include increasing cooperation with municipalities and school boards employing a fulltime partnership facilitator. The conversation around "School Council Action" looks at school councils taking the lead in building an expertise/

skill bank for their schools.

So what do you think? The other broad themes that will be discussed are Governance, Student-Centred Education, Learning Environments, Teaching, and Envisioning Excellence. 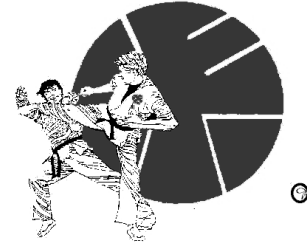

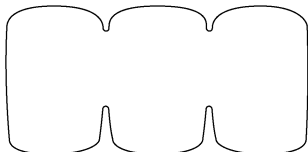

### “My mother needs a root canal...”

This is a question that came to me on the soccer field and I think it highlights a point that everyone needs to be aware of – when a person is informed of a treatment need they must also be informed of the treatment alternatives.

The question in its entirety was: “*My mother is retired and on a fixed income. Her dentist says she needs a root canal, followed by a crown, and the bill will be about \$3000. She has no pain. What should she do?*”

Here is how I considered this question:

**#1: Examination and Diagnosis** – It is important to note that Diagnosis MUST precede Treatment Recommendations. In this case the dentist needs to say: “The examination reveals that you have a dental abscess”; and he must identify the specific tooth. It would be incorrect to simply say: “You need a root canal”; Where? Why?

**#2: Discussion of all TREATMENT OPTIONS with associated Risks and Benefits** of each option – so, (briefly) in this case the options are:

Option #1: **Do nothing** – Risk: Dental Abscesses can make you very sick, and even threaten your life; Benefit: The tooth isn’t a bother right now.

Option #2: **Remove the abscessed tooth:** Risk: injury from the procedure; Benefit: low cost procedure to eliminate the problem.

Option #3: **Root canal procedure:** Risk: the procedure may be ineffective, and it is an expensive process (the tooth will need a crown after the root canal); Benefit: you will likely get to keep your tooth.

After the “options” discussion is complete, the patient can choose what to do next. I am sure that this lady’s dentist followed the procedure listed above; patients tend to forget some of what is said in the office.

I encourage people to press their doctors for a definitive diagnosis prior to any treatment (even a prescription) so that they can completely understand their treatment alternatives. Once you have heard the options, the choice is up to you.

## New Preschool year an exciting time for parents and kids

The beginning of a new year at Preschool is a time to celebrate! Everything about the transition from toddler to Preschooler is new and exciting for both you and your child. With new and exciting can also come fear and anxiety. Preparing yourself and your child for preschool, in an effective and positive way, is crucial to the success they will experience early on in their journey toward independence.

Casual conversations with your youngster while driving, cooking or playing are an excellent way to share expectations and information. The following list has a few ideas you can use to ensure a smooth transition for your youngster come September:

- Take advantage of open houses and meet the teacher nights. Your positive interactions with the teacher will help your child feel comfortable, and they will have an opportunity to explore the room with you.
- Practice independence at home. Picking out new shoes and a special snack will be sure to make your child feel like a “big kid”.
- Talk about your child’s teacher in a positive and exciting way.
- Play pretend Preschool at home and remember to practice sharing, taking turns and being a good friend.

Separation anxiety can be felt more by parents than the child. It can be tough to celebrate their new independence and you may feel like you are simply “handing them over” to the teacher. Plan enough time to get ready in the morning so you are on time and not feeling rushed. Feel free to bring you camera!

Remember that it is ok to leave if your child is crying. Take the time to say a heartfelt good-bye. Tell your child you are proud of them and excited to see all of the new toys and friends they can play with. Remind them that you will be back soon to pick them up and walk out the door. We have your contact information and should your child be in distress for any length of time we will certainly call you back.
