

Greenfield Community League Shiny Hockey

2011/2012 Program:

GCL's Shiny hockey program for 7-11 year old boys and girls will run Saturday mornings from 10am-11am from December through February, weather permitting, at the Greenfield Community hockey rink. This no contact hockey program will emphasize fun, good sportsmanship, and developing basic skating and hockey skills.

Parent coaches will lead the players in warm up and training drills then organize a shiny hockey game.

Players will be accepted on a first come, first served basis starting at 9:45am. A maximum of 30 players will be accepted. If necessary and there are enough players, players may be divided into two lines depending on their skill level.

Players must fill out the registration form and have the waiver signed by their parents before their first game.

Hot chocolate will be served in the skate shack after the game.

Games will be cancelled if the temperature or wind chill is below -20c, if there is too much snow fall to clear the ice in a timely manner, or if it is warm enough to soften the ice.

Cost to play:

\$5 per player per game for GCL members or

\$10 per player per game without GCL membership

If players prefer, they may pay for the entire season (approximately 12 games) instead of a drop-in fee: \$50 for GCL members, \$100 for non members. This fee is due at the first game. There are no refunds even if games are cancelled.

Rules:

This is a non contact program. No body checking, slap shots, or raising the puck will be allowed. Players breaking this rule will have serve penalty time on the bench. Players breaking this rule consistently may have to sit out an entire game or leave the league.

Equipment Required:

Players must have a CSA approved helmet with a cage, skates, hockey gloves, shin pads, a hockey stick (not plastic), and a water bottle labelled with name.

*Full Equipment such as elbow pads, hockey pants, neck protector, shoulder pads and groin protection are recommended.
