

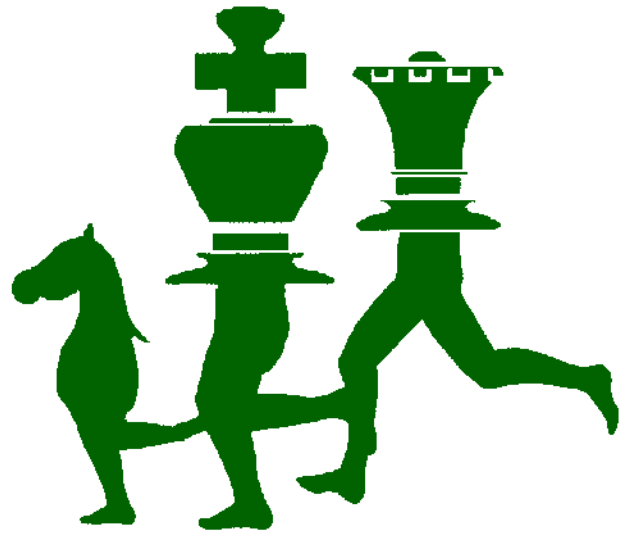

To accommodate a growing number of students besides those in our numerous school programs, we are now offering weekday evening beginner/intermediate classes at Greenfield Community Hall 3803 114 St. and McKernan Hall 11341 78 Avenue. Our popular beginner thru advanced Saturday Knights classes continue at 12013 76 Street.

For Central South and Southwest Edmonton Students: (Smaller class sizes)

Greenfield Community Hall - Monday Evenings, September 21 thru December 14 (no classes on Thanksgiving)

6:30 sharp to 7:30 p.m.: Beginners This class will be for beginners and perhaps those with some previous lessons and even tournament experience rated under 700 by Chess'n Math Association. Priority given to those in Grade 3 and higher. New beginners should know most legal moves and basic principles of the game. **Special Note: Chess on December 21, too, with special tournament for both classes (Details to come)**
12 Classes @ \$11 each plus GST = \$138.60 (\$123.90 for Greenfield Community League Families) (\$115.50 2nd child from same family)

7:35 to at least 8:50 p.m.: Intermediate Students must know how to complete a game, perform checkmate and pawn promotion and if they have a rating it should be above 700. Priority will be given to students with previous lessons and rating and those in Grade 5 and higher.
12 Classes @ \$12.50 each plus GST = \$157.50 (\$141.75 for Green Community League Families) (\$126.00 2nd child from same family)

Classes will consist of short lectures, hands-on exercises, and games rated by national Chess'n Math Association. All playing will abide by international rules, preparing the student to be able to play anywhere and be acknowledged as someone having a basic or higher knowledge of the world's oldest and most respected game. One-on-one coaching tips. Manual and homework sheets. Quizzes and testing with certificates to be awarded. Students must sign a Code of Conduct concerning chess etiquette, good behavior and sportsmanship. Students must show they are putting in a good effort and showing progress in their skills during the fall session to continue to the winter session starting in January.

I understand that failure to abide by the above provision of this Code of Conduct could lead to warnings and, if necessary, suspension from or permanent removal from the class, lesson, tournament or other activity.
